FAITH IN FOCUS: NONE THE WISER?

There are lots of jokes about the genie in the bottle who offers people three wishes. Whatever the joke, the punch-line is always the same: the people end up squandering their good fortune or getting more than they bargained for.

What made Solomon wise was the fact that he knew his own weaknesses and sought make himself a better person. He didn't ask for fame or wealth. Knowing that he was young and unskilled in government, he asked God to make him into a really good king for his people.

For wisdom isn't about being worldly wise or streetwise. It's not a question of intelligence or even being a clever person. Wisdom is about looking at yourself and the world and seeing what God sees. And when you look at yourself and see what is missing, it's about doing something to make up the gap.

Jesus knew only too well that people set their priorities in all sorts of different directions. Yet he tells them that if they were really wise they would forget about all the trivialities of life and seek to live in the kingdom of God. To know the importance of this is to possess a pearl of great price. A pearl of such price, he says, that we ought to be prepared to lose everything else in order to possess it. Some people don't know where to look for this pearl of great price. So their search takes them to Tarot cards and Feng Shui and they end up none the wiser. Others have glimpsed the pearl but were unaware of its value, so they stop going to church because they have to take their children to sport on Sunday mornings. And then there are those who know how valuable a gift lies within their grasp and they struggle daily to possess it. Which are you?
