FAITH IN FOCUS: SOMETHING TO SMILE ABOUT That the gospel should be opposed, someone once remarked, is inevitable; that the gospel should be disbelieved, is to be expected; but that it should be made dull, is intolerable. Yet we are often guilty of treating the good news as if it were a rather dis appointing weather forecast. "Gaudete" (Rejoice!) Sunday, the 3rd Sunday of Advent, is a reminder to us of the explosive fact at the heart of the gospel message: a call to rejoice that our God, who promises us a happiness without end, is very near and will return to set us free from whatever threatens to drag us down. No one expects us to go around with a fixed cosmetic smile on our faces, like some bible enthusiast who has only got hold of half the story. Nor are we required to act like Christian Cheshire cats, pretending that our faith means that we no longer experience the downs as well as the ups of life. But what we can smile about is the secure hope that what God has promised to us will not be withdrawn. The God who comes to us day by day, often unknown to us, the God of surprises and disguises, comes not to point out our human frailty but to save us and raise us up. This is our "blessed hope". The Advent good news is about bandaging what is hurt, binding up what is broken, and making the small seeds of trust into a forest of faith. Paul exhorts us to be happy at all times, but with that deep-down happiness which comes from knowing that we belong to a God whose love for us never fails, and whose coming among us is designed not for our punishment but for our support. ADVENT The season of Advent has a twofold character. It is a time of preparation for Christmas, when Christ's first coming is remembered; and it is a time to direct mind and heart to await his second coming. Advent is, therefore, a time of devout and expectant delight. In the second phase of the season of Advent, from **17th December** (this coming Wednesday), the liturgy is more directly addressed to preparing to commemorate and celebrate the birth of Our Lord, and the readings at daily Mass reflect this.

RECOMMENDED for ADVENT • Try to get to Mass during the week: there is so much beauty in the readings of this season. • Celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation (confession): there will be a penance service at St Francis', Maidstone, on **Monday 22nd December at 7.30pm**.
