FAITH IN FOCUS: ANY TWO WISHES When the genie appeared, he granted the man any two wishes. The man's first wish was for an everlasting glass of beer. The beer magically appeared, the man drank it, and it refilled itself automatically. When the genie asked him for his second wish, he said, "I'll have another one of those, please." It hurts just to think about it, doesn't it? We find it hard to comprehend that something so good could be everlasting that it would never run out. When Jesus talked to Nicodemus, he told him that if he was prepared to give up the darkness and "walk in the light", then he would enjoy a life which is everlasting. Walking in the light means recognizing our sinfulness and our constant need of God's supporting grace, and living with the promise of eternal life. Even armed with this knowledge, we still tend to put limits on God's goodness. Like the man

with the genie, we wonder whether God's store of patience and mercy might soon be exhausted. Can it really be true that God will never ever give up on us? Part of our problem is that we are brought up to learn that there's no such thing as a free lunch. Society tells us that you only get what you pay for. We cannot easily accept the something-for-nothing idea.

Yet scripture tells us the opposite. The people of Ephesus were reminded by Paul that God is so generous with his mercy that he has reserved a place in heaven even for the worst sinner who repents. He speaks of God as being "infinitely rich in grace." Like the genie, God's riches can never be exhausted. On "Laetare Sunday" we rejoice not just because God offers us so much, but because if we accept our true human condition, if we come out of the dark and walk in the light, then God's grace is free.
