PENTECOST SUNDAY

FAITH IN FOCUS: ADVOCATING CHANGE There's a medieval song that was sung in Latin at Pentecost while the deacon carried the gospel-book in the procession at Mass, before proclaiming the gospel itself. It's called the Pentecost Sequence and it contains line after line that speaks about the gift of the Holy Spirit. It describes the Spirit as Lord of Light, Father of the Poor, Best Consoler, Sweet Comfort, Healer, Giver of Strength, Renewer, etc. In today's gospel Jesus says he will ask the Father to send the "Advocate". We tend to think of an advocate as someone who campaigns on a particular topic: an advocate for equal rights or an advocate for better housing conditions. In fact, the word advocate really means someone whom you call to stand by your side in solidarity. It's the equivalent of the other strange sounding word, Paraclete.

Pentecost rounds off Jesus' saving work on earth as the Spirit completes the action of Jesus in taking on our humanity and humanising it to the point where it can glimpse the

divine. What we see happening at that first Pentecost is that Jesus has not left us alone like orphans; he has sent the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, to be by our side. And the effects are immediate. From being a frightened bunch of weak men, huddled for safety behind a locked door, the apostles are transformed by the Spirit's presence, are emboldened to go out and confront their fears, proclaiming their faith in Christ to people from every race and nation. Someone once said that we should pray as if everything depended on God but act as if everything depended on us. Certainly this is true of the Spirit. We are only too aware of our weakness and our inability to "go it alone" when it comes to living out our faith and telling others about it. That's why we pray constantly for the outpouring of the Spirit in our lives, that we may be transformed, strengthened, inspired and supported in our Christian lives. One thing that we cannot do it to restrict the Spirit. If we ask for the Advocate then we agree to an adventure in faith that has no boundaries. After all, we call on the Spirit just to make us feel good; we ask for the Spirit to come and transform creation: Lord, send out your Spirit and renew the face of the earth!

PENTECOST The Day of Pentecost is the culmination of the Easter season. It is also referred to as "Whit Sunday", from the phrase "White Sunday", referring to the practice of the newly baptized appearing in their white baptismal garments on that day. The paschal candle is now moved to the baptistery and is lit at the celebration of Baptism and the candles of those baptized are lit from it. It is also used at funerals. **EASTER DUTIES** The last day for fulfilling the precept of Easter Communion is the feast of the Most Holy Trinity, **next Sunday**. Canon 2042 of *The Catechism* states: The third precept ('You shall humbly receive your Creator in Holy Communion at least during the Easter season') guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and centre of the Christian liturgy.

CAFOD The Catholic charity is very grateful to us for the support we showed during its Lent Appeal. A grand total of £3.5 million was achieved from donations from throughout the UK, and as promised the government will give the full amount promised at the start of the campaign: another £3.5 million. CONFIRMATIONS "The reception of the sacrament of Confirmation is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace. For by the sacrament of Confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit. Hence they are, as true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed." (*Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1285.*) Maidstone area Confirmations will take place on Sunday **9th October**, with a retreat at Whitstable on **8th** to **10th July**. The preparation day will be on Sunday **2nd October**. As before we are inviting those who are not confirmed (School Year 9 or above) to apply. We hope to be able to run a short course in Bearsted later in the summer. If you wish to be confirmed see Fr Geoffrey or Deacon Cyril.

FATHER PAUL MASON Pope Francis has appointed Father Paul Mason as the new Auxiliary Bishop of Southwark. Father Paul is currently Episcopal Vicar for Kent. His Episcopal Ordination will take place in Saint George's Cathedral, Southwark, **on 31st May**, at midday, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. He will join Bishop Patrick Lynch and Bishop Paul Hendricks as Auxiliary Bishops of the Diocese of Southwark, succeeding Bishop John Hine.
