



NEWS FROM THE BISHOPS' CONFERENCE With effect from the First Sunday of Advent 2017, two holydays of obligation are being reinstated. This decision was made by the Bishops of England and Wales, and has been confirmed by the Holy See. The days are: * The **Epiphany of the Lord** — 6th January (transferred to the adjacent Sunday when it falls on Saturday or Monday). * The **Ascension of the Lord** — Thursday after Sixth Sunday of Easter.
