FAITH in FOCUS: DIFFICULT DECISIONS If we are lucky, we might get through life without making any painful or difficult decisions, but we can't all be so lucky. There are some who will choose to give birth to a child knowing that the baby has a disability. There are those who will choose to care for a relative who is very ill or dying. These decisions are made with no real clue of what lies ahead, but they will always be made out of love. There's no doubt about if, for people who make difficult decisions in life there will be great difficulties ahead. What is equally certain is that there will be great rewards too. Our Nativity scenes show Mary and Joseph smiling fondly at the baby Jesus as though bringing the son of God into the world had been one of the easiest decisions to make. As

we look in at the cosy scene, we have to remember that the history of salvation would have been completely different if either Mary or Joseph had said 'no' to God's plan. Saying 'yes' to God's plan didn't give Mary or Joseph an easy life, but being part of God's plan in such a direct and practical way must have brought them great fulfilment, and of course, it earned them a place in the history books for all eternity.

We too are part of God's plan, though it probably doesn't feel like it. We too have a part to play in leaving the world a better place than we found it. What is God asking of each of us? Is there a nagging vocation that keeps throwing opportunities into our path, opportunities that up until now we have managed to sidestep? Advent is a time to make decisions that will turn our predictable lives into rollercoasters with difficult lows but rewarding highs. *Chapel Bell*

HOMELESS at CHRISTMAS (Worth repeating from last week.) We tend to have a preconception that those who are homeless are run-aways, addicts or those with mental health problems. Whilst there is truth in this, there are many other reasons why any one of us could end up homeless. It is said that any one of us could be just a couple of pay days away from being out on the street. Any one of us could fall prey to an unscrupulous landlord, job loss or the breakdown of a relationship. Charities like Shelter, Crisis or the Salvation Army are equipped not just to support the homeless at Christmas, but support people back into a safe place to live. Think about making a donation this Christmas to one of the homeless charities to help put someone's life back on track. CHRISTMAS FOOD BANKS: It isn't hard to know that we are increasingly dependent on food banks. Food banks have their critics, but for those with nothing to live on they are a lifeline. As you do your weekly shop think of families with nothing to eat this Christmas. Try looking out for those 'two for one' promotions and give one away. If everyone who went into the supermarket bought one extra item the food banks would be full this Christmas.
